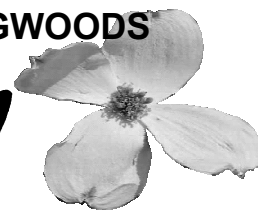




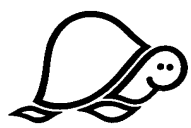

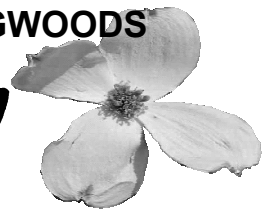

NAME	FAMILY	COLOR	DESCRIPTION
ANGUSTATA EVERGREEN	KOUSA	WHITE	Fast growing, upright, seedling evergreen dogwood with medium flowers in the spring .
APPALACHIAN MIST	FLORIDA	WHITE	A newer University of Tennessee introduction that is mildew resistant with red fall foliage.
APPALACHIAN SNOW	FLORIDA	WHITE	A newer University of Tennessee introduction that is mildew resistant and upright growing.
AURORA PP#7205	STELLAR	WHITE	These hybrids have proven to be more resistant than Cornus florida to the common dogwood borer, dogwood anthracnose, and powdery mildew. They bloom after C. florida but before C. kousa. Blooms last about 2 weeks. They are very vigorous, erect in habit, and uniformly wide from top to bottom. They are very floriferous with age. White bracts provide a heavily textured, velvety appearance and become creamy white as they age.
BAILEYI	SERICEA	WHITE	A multi-stem dogwood whose most spectacular attribute is bright reddish winter stem color. Rich green leaves turn reddish purple in fall. Small white flowers are followed by bluish fruits. Plant is smaller and more shrubby than the other dogwoods.
BLUE SHADOW	KOUSA	WHITE	Dark blue-green foliage that is reddish in fall. Typical Kousa flowers and fruit. Large growing, upright habit.
BOB TIMBERLAKE ETERNAL™ PP#13069	FLORIDA	WHITE	A very striking new dogwood with almost double, large white blooms. It is a vigorous grower, faster than Plena.
CELESTIAL PP#7204	STELLAR	WHITE	These hybrids have proven to be more resistant than Cornus florida to the common dogwood borer and Dogwood Anthracnose. They bloom after Cornus florida but before kousa. Blooms last about 2 weeks. Plants branch low and are uniformly wide from base to top. Floral display is quite spectacular even when viewed from a distance. At first flowers have a greenish tinge, but become fully white in a few days.
CELESTIAL SHADOW	STELLAR	WHITE	A variegated sport of Celestial that is similar in growth habits to other selections in the Stellar Series. Holds yellow/green color all summer with no burn.
CHEROKEE BRAVE™ PP#10166	FLORIDA	RED	Vigorous grower, reddish pink flowers with a white center. New growth is burgundy-red turning a dark green with age. Leaves are larger than normal and glossy in appearance. Shows strong resistance to pests and diseases due to strong vigor and smooth, slick bark. Resistant to mildew.
CHEROKEE CHIEF	FLORIDA	RED	Flowers are a rich ruby red. New growth is a bright red, much deeper than usual, reflecting the deeper color of the blossoms. Fall color is bright scarlet shading to green.
CHEROKEE DAYBREAK	FLORIDA	WHITE	A variegated colorful foliage with white, normal sized flowers. Leaves are green margined with creamy white. Foliage does not scorch in hot weather. Fall color turns pink to deep red. Plant is vigorous, upright in habit.
CHEROKEE PRINCESS	FLORIDA	WHITE	Large pure white flowers in early spring. Is a very vigorous, upright, symmetrical growing tree. Nice to use for multiple trees where similar appearance is desired. Bright fall color with good red berries. Has very large leaves and smooth bark for borer resistance. Heavy flowering every year. High resistance to spot anthracnose and canker.
CHEROKEE SUNSET	FLORIDA	RED	Noted for its purplish-red blooms, distinct pinkish-red tipped new growth, and colorful foliage. Foliage matures to green with a broad margin of yellow that does not burn in the summer heat. Fall color ranges from pink through red to purple. It is vigorous and resistant to anthracnose.
CLOUD-9	FLORIDA	WHITE	Has the largest of the white flowers nearly 6" across. Is slow-growing with showy white flowers. It blooms profusely even as a young plant. One of the most cold hardy of the dogwoods. Very large dark green leaves turn red in fall. It is a solid performer in the Southeast and is resistant to canker.
FIREBIRD	FLORIDA	RED	A variegated form of Cherokee Brave. Green and yellow foliage with red spring flowers. Grows slightly slower than other variegated selections in the Florida family.



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NAME	FAMILY	COLOR	DESCRIPTION
MILKY WAY	KOUSA	WHITE	White flower with pointed petals appear after leaves have appeared, several weeks later than C. florida. Very floriferous. Broad, bushy form suitable for small landscape. Fall foliage is red to scarlet. Seems to have abundant pink strawberry-like seeds in late summer. Borer and anthracnose resistant. Originally developed from a group of plants so all are not replicas of one plant.
MILKY WAY IMPROVED	KOUSA	WHITE	Selected plant of Milky Way, chosen for its vigorous growth and uniform branch structure.
PINK	FLORIDA	PINK	One of the most popular of all the dogwoods. Pink to pinkish red flowers with some variation in color. Blooms a few days later than the white varieties. Resistant to canker. Not a cultivar so some variation will occur in shape, size, and flowers. New growth is tinged red in the spring. Fall foliage is deep red.
PINK KOUSA	KOUSA	PINK	A vigorous growing Kousa with medium pink blooms. (coming soon!)
PLENA	FLORIDA	WHITE	Is an medium sized dogwood tree known for its double white flowers.
STELLAR PINK® PP#7207	STELLAR	PINK	These hybrids have proven to be more resistant than Cornus florida to the common dogwood borer and Dogwood Anthracnose. They bloom after C. florida but before C. kousa. Blooms last about 2 weeks. Plants are very vigorous and erect. They branch low and are uniformly wide from top to bottom.
WOLF EYES	KOUSA	WHITE	Prominent white-margined leaves on a compact spreading plant. Is less susceptible to burning than most variegated dogwoods. Outstanding pink to red fall color. Slow growing, shrubby plant that does best in partial shade.



Legend of the Dogwood Tree

At the time of Crucifixion the dogwood had been the size of the oak and other forest trees. So firm and strong was the tree that it was chosen as the timber for the cross. To be used thus for such a cruel purpose greatly distressed the tree, and Jesus nailed upon it, sensed this. In His gentle pity for all sorrow and suffering Jesus said to the tree: "Because of your regret and pity for My suffering, never again shall the dogwood tree grow large enough to be used as a cross. Henceforth it shall be slender and bent and twisted and its blossoms shall be in the form of a cross...two long and two short petals. And in the center of the outer edge of each petal there will be nail prints, brown with rust and stained with red, and in the center of the flower will be a crown of thorns, and all who see it will remember."
